Governor Liz Teseiro had pins made for everyone to celebrate Persons Day in Canada on 18 October. A great talking point for Canadian attendees because the Americans were curious to know what "Persons Day" was all about! It marks the day in 1929 when the



historic decision to include women in the legal definition of "persons" was handed down by Canada's highest court of appeal. This gave some women the right to be appointed to the Senate of Canada and paved the way for women's increased participation in public and

political life. Though this decision did not include all women, such as Indigenous women and women of Asian heritage and descent, it did mark critical progress in the advancement of gender equality in Canada. Club members will receive a pin in their "Welcome to Zonta" package at the club chartering ceremony.

Val was thrilled that the Zonta Club of Ottawa won the District International Award, mostly due to Val organising a club webinar with Carole Theobald who chairs the Zonta Says NOW to gender-equal climate action Think Tank.

News from Zonta International Canada Caucus

A growing number of municipalities have declared Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) an epidemic. Last March, City Councillor Ariel Troster proposed a motion (17.1) that the City of Ottawa declare IPV an epidemic and that the mayor write to the Premier in support of Lanark County Council's motion and to create provincial legislation requesting that IPV be formally declared an epidemic in Ontario. The motion was passed unanimously. Now if only the province of Ontario would support the municipal declarations!




Kathleen Kardasz runs the Hamilton Marathon Road2Hope – 5 November 2023

News from District 18 (Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Togo, Uganda, Madagascar now forming)

On Wednesday 8 November, the Zonta Club of Accra Metropolitan in collaboration with the Zonta clubs in Ghana, organised a webinar to celebrate Zonta Day: Preparing the Youth to Adopt Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the digital transformation era. Almost 2000 high school girls from seven high schools attended the webinar. The largest contingent was 1723 girls from Holy Child Secondary High School. I wish I could share a few screen shots of these lovely young girls, but unfortunately, I would need their permission.

The questions the girls posed in the chat during Q&A were quite astute. Here is an example. The answer was a wake-up call.

The webinar was well attended by others, too. One woman asked in the chat how she could join Zonta. The Zonta Club of Accra Metropolitan president will follow up.

On **Thursday 9 November**, the five Zonta Clubs of Accra coordinated a mission to help women and children flood victims in Ada. We got pictures of the flood victims' houses from the Social Welfare Officer in Ada. The buildings are in a precarious state and too dangerous to go back into. Although the flood waters have receded, the water is polluted and prohibits fishing which is a staple food for the community.

They have a group WhatsApp for club presidents and vice presidents and my contact, Lydia, at the Zonta Club of Accra II kindly added me to the group. I am now considered "affiliated" with Accra II. Originally, I was going to accompany them, but the date was changed to my teaching day. I think there have been over 100 posts in the last week as they prepared:

- collecting clothing, diapers, mini biscuits for children, menstrual products and more
- sorting and packing supplies
- booking a coaster bus driver and a pick-up driver
- contacting the Ghanaian TV for media coverage
- scheduling to pick up a reporter and cameraman
- scheduling pick-up points, lunch and other logistics
- deciding when, where, how to disseminate the Zonta message to empower and build a better world for women











So much to organise, but 17 people hit the road! On the bus in the front seat is Sam Hollingworth from the Zonta Club of Brisbane, an affiliated member of the Zonta Club of Accra II. We are getting together for a "cuppa".

Upon arriving home, one of our sister Zontians wrote:


Oh what liberation!
Oh what fulfillment!


There's no other healing to the soul than the one that the giver receives.


